Article Overview

Yes, optical fibre cables are subject to anti-dumping measures in multiple jurisdictions, including the EU and the UK, with duties imposed on imports from countries like China and India.

European Union

The European Commission has imposed and recently tightened anti-dumping duties on optical fibre cables imported from China. Following investigations, the EU found that Chinese exporters had reduced prices to counteract previous duties, prompting a doubling of anti-dumping rates to between 39.4% and 88% to restore fair competition . Additionally, imports from India are also subject to anti-dumping duties, with rates ranging from 2.9% to 8.8%, coordinated alongside countervailing duties to ensure consistent enforcement . These measures aim to protect the European optical fibre industry, which is critical for broadband infrastructure and employs thousands across the EU .

Are optical cables subject to anti-dumping measures

United Kingdom

The UK Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) has determined that optical fibre cables from China are being dumped and causing injury to UK industry. As a result, definitive anti-dumping duties ranging from 23% to 46.2% apply to imports from Chinese exporters, effective from 11 July 2023 for a period of five years . The duties cover single-mode optical fibre cables with protective casing, whether or not containing electric conductors, excluding certain connectorised or submarine-use cables .

Rationale and Enforcement

Anti-dumping measures are applied when imported goods are sold below fair market value, causing injury to domestic producers. In the case of optical cables, both the EU and UK investigations concluded that foreign exporters were benefiting from unfair competitive advantages, such as subsidies or price undercutting, which threatened local industries . These duties are enforced through customs declarations and require importers to comply with specific documentation to qualify for the applicable rates .

Summary

Optical fibre cables are actively monitored under anti-dumping regulations in major markets. Importers from countries like China and India must account for significant duties when exporting to the EU or UK, and these measures are periodically reviewed to ensure continued protection of domestic industries and fair trade practices .
