

Armenia has underground fiber optic cables

Poti currently acts as the exit node for two major submarine fiber optic cables. The first - the Caucasus Cable Network - connects to the European Union by passing under the Black Sea and connecting to terrestrial networks in Balchik, Bulgaria. This visualization shows the growth of the undersea cable network, global internet peering capacity, and the distribution of IP addresses via BGP announcements over time. For more details and insights, please read this. Around 85 percent of Armenia's Internet traffic travels northwards through Georgian fiber optic networks owned by "Caucasus Online" (CO). Fiber optic cables may be classified into two types: terrestrial cables, which travel on land and are buried underground, and submarine cables, which lie along. The company's network is based on fiber-optic infrastructure and is built underground, connecting Armenia with the outside world across the borders of Georgia and Iran. OVIO is equipped with three international communication lines to Russia and Europe, physically and geographically separated.
