Overview of the Tee Method

A tee connection in a cable tray system allows a branch tray to extend from a main tray, forming a T-shaped junction. This is commonly used to route cables from a main distribution path to equipment, panels, or other devices. Tee fittings are available in ventilated, solid, or wire-mesh tray types, depending on the application and environmental requirements .

Installation Steps

o Tray Cutting and Preparation

- o Cut the main tray and branch tray ends squarely to ensure a flush fit.
- o Remove any sharp edges to prevent cable damage.
- o Tee fittings may require minor adjustments or trimming to align with the trays .

o Fitting Attachment

- o Position the T-piece fitting at the junction of the main and branch trays.
- o Secure the fitting using tray clips, bolts, or other manufacturer-recommended fasteners.
- o Ensure the branch tray is aligned at a 90-degree angle to the main tray .

o Support and Load Distribution

- o Avoid using trays as lifting points during handling; always use proper slings or supports .
- o Verify that the tee junction does not interfere with cable routing or create sharp bends that exceed



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recommended radii. By following these steps, a cable tray tee can be installed safely and efficiently, providing a reliable path for branching cables while maintaining structural integrity and compliance with electrical standards.
