Due to their exposure to the open air because of the cable trays, the wires contained within need a very durable outer covering. The regulations dictate that the cables must either be Type TC (also known as Tray Rated) or must be metal-armored (Type MC). This is a description of how to select, install, and support these metal or plastic frames, on which electrical wires are installed. You should consider it as a series of instructions that make the buildings resistant to. Prohibited Areas: Cable trays cannot be used in hoistways or enclosed spaces and must remain accessible. Grounding: Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors (EGC) if they meet NEC requirements. Cable trays are available in a number of different configurations, including ladder, ventilated trough. Cable trays should be installed in accordance with the latest revision of the NEC, NEMA VE 2, and the manufacturer's installation instructions.
