The ideal structure for consecutive junction boxes is: Cable A -> Adapter in Box 1 -> Patch Cord -> Adapter in Box 2 -> Cable B This setup maintains low insertion loss, allows for quick replacement, and ensures compliance with standards such as IEC 61756 .

Optional Splicing

If a permanent connection is required, fusion or mechanical splicing can be used, but this should be done outside the junction boxes in a controlled environment with proper tools . Splicing inside compact boxes increases the risk of micro-bending, dust contamination, and makes future maintenance difficult.

Practical Tips

- o Ensure enough slack in the fiber to avoid bending below the minimum bend radius.
- o Label all connections clearly for easier troubleshooting.
- o Use environmentally sealed junction boxes if the installation is outdoors or in harsh conditions .
- o Test the connection with an optical power meter or OTDR to verify signal integrity after installation. By following these steps, you can safely and efficiently connect two fiber optic junction boxes consecutively while maintaining network performance and flexibility.
