

Connecting a switch to a wireless router

Optional Router Configuration

- o Access Router Settings: Log in via a web browser using the router's IP (commonly 192.168.0.1 or 192.168.1.1) and admin credentials .
- o Enable DHCP: Ensure the router assigns IP addresses automatically to devices connected through the switch .
- o Update Wi-Fi Settings: Configure SSID, password, and security protocol (WPA2/WPA3) if needed .
- o Firmware Updates: Check for updates to improve performance and security .

Tips

- o Multiple Switches: You can daisy-chain additional switches to expand your network further .
- o Use LAN Ports Only: Do not connect the switch to the router's WAN port; this is reserved for the internet connection .
- o Wired vs Wireless: Devices connected via Ethernet to the switch generally experience faster and more stable connections than Wi-Fi . By following these steps, you can effectively expand your network, providing
