

# Connecting three routers to one fiber optic cable

## Article Overview

## Primary Setup

Fiber optic internet typically enters your home via an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts the optical signal into an electrical signal for your router. ## Adding Secondary Routers

To connect additional routers:

- o LAN-to-WAN Connection: Connect the WAN port of the second router to a LAN port on the primary router. Configure the second router to use a different subnet to avoid IP conflicts. This allows the second router to create a separate network segment while still accessing the internet through the primary router.
- o Point-to-Point Links: For more advanced setups, you can create point-to-point (P2P) links between routers using unique subnets (e.g., /30 networks). This method is useful if you want each router to route traffic independently while still using the primary router as the gateway.
- o Third Router: The third router can be connected similarly, either to the primary router or to one of the secondary routers, depending on your network topology. Using a star topology with the primary router at the center is recommended for performance and easier management.

## Considerations

- o IP Addressing: Ensure each router uses a distinct subnet to prevent conflicts.
- o Performance: Bandwidth is shared across all routers, so heavy usage on one router can affect others.
- o Network Management: The primary router should handle DHCP and firewall functions to maintain security and proper routing.
- o Alternative: Using Ethernet switches connected to the primary router can simplify the network and allow multiple access points without complex routing. By following these methods, you can effectively connect three routers to a single fiber optic connection while maintaining network stability and performance.
