- o Welding thin galvanized steel is challenging; it may release toxic fumes. Use proper ventilation or consider stainless steel or pre-galvanized sheets .
- o For small DIY projects, bolting or using prefabricated trays may be safer and easier than welding, especially for home or office cable management .
- o Ensure the tray is securely mounted to walls, ceilings, or under desks to support cable weight without sagging .
