

Does a 200 Mbps fiber optic connection require a router

ISP-Provided vs. Personal Routers

Many ISPs provide a fiber-compatible router at no extra cost or for a small monthly fee. These routers are optimized for fiber speeds and often include Wi-Fi 6 or Wi-Fi 7 technology for better coverage and device handling. You can also use your own router, but ensure it supports at least 200Mbps throughput to fully utilize your plan.
