Standard Cable Tray Lengths

Span and Support Considerations

- o Long Span Trays: Supported every 14 to 20 feet, often outdoors or for heavy cable loads.
- o Extra-Long Span Trays: Supported at intervals exceeding 20 feet, used to reduce the number of expensive supports in outdoor or road-crossing installations . Emergency cable trays, which carry critical circuits such as fire alarms, emergency lighting, or backup power, follow the same standard lengths but may require shorter support intervals to ensure structural integrity and compliance with safety codes.

- o Material and Load: The tray material and thickness affect allowable span and load capacity. Emergency trays may use heavier gauge materials to support additional safety factors.
- o Installation: Proper splice plate placement and support spacing are crucial, especially for long or extra-long spans, to prevent sagging or failure.
- o Code Compliance: Emergency cable trays must meet electrical continuity, fire resistance, and mechanical strength standards, often guided by IEC 61537 or NEC requirements .
