Inspection and Troubleshooting

Observing these conditions helps prevent signal dropouts and service interruptions.

Preventing Damage

Fiber optic cables are reliable but sensitive to physical stress. To prevent damage:

- o Maintain the correct bend radius to avoid signal loss or fiber breakage .
- o Use cable trays, racks, or ties to support hanging cables and prevent sagging .
- o Avoid crushing, twisting, or sharp bends, especially in outdoor installations.
- o Store spare cables properly and test them before deployment . Environmental factors like water, animals, and UV exposure can also affect outdoor cables, so protective conduits or armored cables may be necessary.

Cleaning and Connector Maintenance

Regularly clean connectors and inspect for dirt or damage. Use dust caps when connectors are not in use, and avoid unnecessary mating/unmating, as repeated handling can wear ferrules and alignment sleeves, increasing optical loss . High-power lasers in active links can pose eye hazards, so always follow safety protocols when inspecting live fibers.

Monitoring and Documentation

Implement fiber network monitoring to detect faults early. Track signal strength, attenuation, and other key metrics. Document cable runs, splices, and connector locations to simplify troubleshooting and future maintenance . Preventative maintenance should be planned and performed without disrupting active services, while post-fault maintenance should be executed promptly after detecting a fault .
