Custom Patch Cords

Another approach is to use a custom fiber patch cord with different connectors on each end:

- o One end terminated with a square SC connector.
- o The other end terminated with a round FC or ST connector.
- o Custom cords are pre-tested for low insertion loss and are ideal for permanent or semi-permanent connections .

Installation Tips

- o Ensure the fiber mode (single-mode or multimode) matches on both ends.
- o Clean all connectors and adapters with fiber cleaning tools to prevent contamination.
- o Avoid bending the fiber sharply; maintain the minimum bend radius to prevent signal loss.
- o Label the patch cord or adapter to indicate the hybrid connection for future maintenance.
