Due to the absence of a universal European standard, some manufacturers, like Cablofil, follow stringent standards such as DIN 4102-12, which tests cable trays in high-temperature ovens for durations of 30, 60, and 90 minutes at temperatures up to 1000°C . These tests ensure that the tray system can maintain cable integrity and resist fire spread under extreme conditions.

Applications

Fire cable trays are commonly used in high-risk environments such as data centers, hospitals, industrial plants, oil and gas facilities, and rail systems . They are particularly important where continuous power supply and safety are critical, as a fire in a standard cable tray could damage equipment, disrupt operations, and endanger lives .
