

# How to arrange the colors of cables connected to the distribution box

### General Principles

- o Use Standardized Color Codes: Assign colors based on cable function to quickly identify connections. For example, in network environments:

- o Strip and Untwist Wires: Remove the outer sheath and untwist individual wires. Straighten them for proper alignment .
- o Align by Color: Arrange wires according to the chosen wiring standard (T568A or T568B) and ensure each pair is correctly positioned.
- o Trim and Insert: Cut wires to uniform length, leaving about 1/2 inch exposed, then insert into the RJ45 jack or terminal block according to the pinout .
- o Crimp and Test: Use a crimping tool to secure connections and verify continuity with a cable tester.
- o Label Clearly: Apply visible, legible labels indicating cable function, source, and destination. This reduces errors during maintenance and future upgrades .

### Best Practices

- o Consistency: Always use the same color scheme and wiring standard throughout the distribution box.
- o Documentation: Maintain a diagram or spreadsheet of cable assignments for reference.
- o Future-Proofing: Leave space for additional cables and ensure labeling is durable and readable.
