

How to install the silicone pads in the distribution box

Silicone pads in a distribution box are installed by cleaning the box, aligning the pad, pressing it around cables, trimming excess, and securing the cover to ensure a tight seal.

Step-by-Step Installation

1. Prepare the Distribution Box Ensure the box is clean, dry, and free from dust or debris. This is crucial for proper adhesion and sealing of the silicone pad . 2. Handle the Silicone Pad Remove the protective liner from one side of the pad. Align the pad so it fits centrally over the box or around the intended penetration points. Silicone pads can be installed on the inside or outside of the box depending on the design . 3. Apply the Pad Press and mold the pad firmly into the back and sides of the box, ensuring it surrounds all cables and conduits. For areas where cables enter the box, cut small slits in the pad to fit snugly around each cable . Work the pad into a smooth, even thickness to cover the entire surface. 4. Trim Excess Material After pressing the pad into place, remove any remaining protective liner and trim off excess material at corners or edges to leave a neat finish . 5. Secure the Box Cover Replace and secure the distribution box cover or socket plate. Ensure the pad remains in place and forms a tight seal around all openings to prevent dust, moisture, or fire hazards . 6. Safety Precautions Wear gloves to avoid skin irritation from fibers in the pad. In unventilated areas, use a disposable mask and goggles if working overhead. Clean the area with a vacuum and rinse hands in cold water before washing . 7. Final Checks Verify that the pad is properly seated around all cables and conduits. Ensure the box is stable and the cover is tightly secured. This ensures both mechanical protection and fire or moisture resistance . By following these steps, the silicone pad will provide an effective seal, protecting the distribution box from environmental hazards while maintaining accessibility for maintenance.
