

How to open a cable tray

Opening a cable tray involves safely removing or lifting the tray cover or side panels to access the cables inside, using appropriate tools and following safety precautions.

Identify the Type of Cable Tray

- o Close and Secure: After work is complete, replace the cover or panel, tighten fasteners, and ensure the tray is level and stable .

- o Check grounding: Ensure the tray remains properly grounded after opening.
- o Avoid overloading: Maintain proper fill ratios to prevent sagging or overheating.
