Avoid over-tightening ties to prevent cable damage and maintain proper bend radii .

Label and Document

Label each cable clearly using printed tags, color coding, or adhesive labels. Maintain a network diagram or documentation showing cable paths, endpoints, and device connections. This simplifies troubleshooting, upgrades, and replacements, saving time and reducing errors .

Optimize for Safety and Maintenance

Ensure cables are secured and off the floor to reduce tripping hazards. Use under-desk trays, wall-mounted channels, or cable looms to conceal and protect cables. Regularly inspect and maintain cable connections to prevent wear and accidental disconnections .
