

How to place the fiber optic box socket panel

Article Overview

Install the fiber optic box socket by selecting a dry, accessible wall, securing the back box, carefully routing the fiber cable, and connecting it to the ONT with proper connectors.

Step 1: Choose the Location

Select a dry, accessible wall near power outlets and your ONT. Avoid high-moisture areas like bathrooms or kitchens. Ensure the fiber path is free of sharp bends or obstacles, maintaining a minimum bend radius of 30mm to prevent signal loss or fiber damage .

Step 2: Prepare the Wall

- o Mark the intended mounting height.
- o Cut a 60mm x 40mm hole for flush-mounted boxes using a template.
- o For surface-mounted boxes, drill holes for the bracket or backplate .

Step 3: Secure the Box

- o Insert the fiber wall socket back box into the wall or attach the surface bracket.
- o Use screws to secure it, ensuring a depth of at least 40mm for proper fiber coiling .

Step 4: Route the Fiber Cable

- o Feed the incoming fiber cable through the box's entry port.
- o Coil any excess fiber inside the box, leaving 50cm of slack and maintaining the minimum bend radius .
- o If using armored cables, ensure proper grounding to the building ground .

Step 5: Connect the Fiber

- o Terminate the fiber with the correct connector type (commonly SC/APC for GPON networks).
- o Snap the pigtail connector into the socket adapter.
- o Cap any unused ports immediately to prevent dust contamination .

Step 6: Attach the Faceplate

- o Snap the faceplate onto the back box to secure the installation.
- o Ensure the fiber is neatly organized and protected inside the box .

Step 7: Connect to the ONT

- o Use a fiber patch cable (SC/APC to SC/APC) to connect the wall socket to your ONT.
- o Measure light levels with a power meter; acceptable GPON range is -8 dBm to -27 dBm. Recheck splices if loss exceeds -27 dBm .

Step 8: Safety and Maintenance

- o Always wear safety glasses when handling fiber.
- o Avoid touching the fiber tip or bending it sharply.
- o Follow local building codes and ISP requirements.
- o If unsure about splicing or armored cables, contact a qualified technician . By following these steps, you can ensure a secure, organized, and high-performance fiber optic connection in your home or office.
