

How to use pulleys when laying cables on cable trays

A pulley system can simplify cable installation in trays by allowing cables to be pulled or pushed along the tray safely and efficiently.

Setting Up the Pulley System

- o **Position and Release:** Once the cable reaches its destination, detach it from the pull string and lay it neatly in the tray. Repeat the process for additional cables as needed .

Best Practices for Cable Tray Installation

- o **Cable Organization:** Lay cables in an organized manner to prevent tangling and allow for proper airflow. Avoid excessive bending to prevent insulation damage (Apex Tray) .
- o **Tray Fill and Spacing:** Do not exceed 40% of the tray's capacity. Maintain proper spacing and secure cables at regular intervals to prevent sagging and overheating (ExpertCE) .
- o **Support and Safety:** Ensure the tray and pulley supports can handle the combined weight of cables and any additional loads. Only competent personnel should perform installation, following relevant standards such as BS EN 61537 and NEC Article 392 (BEAMA) .
- o **Future Maintenance:** Keep cables accessible and clearly marked for easier maintenance and upgrades. Use markers or labels to identify cable types and destinations .
