

How to use the cable management rack in a low-voltage cabinet

- o Keep low-voltage cables separate from high-voltage lines to reduce electromagnetic interference and minimize safety hazards .
- o Use entry protection devices or brush panels at cable entry points to prevent abrasion and maintain strain relief .

Labeling and Documentation

- o Label each cable clearly at both ends to simplify troubleshooting and future maintenance. Include identifiers for cable type, source, and destination .
- o Maintain documentation of cable routes and connections, which helps during upgrades, repairs, or audits .

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- o Regularly inspect the cabinet to ensure cables remain organized and secure.
 - o Avoid overloading the rack; distribute cables evenly to maintain airflow and prevent overheating .
 - o Follow local electrical codes and standards for low-voltage installations to ensure compliance and safety .
