- o Material and Rating: Plenum-rated conduits cost more than riser-rated or standard PVC.
- o Diameter and Wall Type: Larger diameters and corrugated or split-wall designs increase price.
- o Length and Quantity: Bulk purchases reduce per-foot cost.
- o Installation Complexity: Conduits routed through ceilings, walls, or raised floors may require additional fittings, couplings, and labor .
