

Installation of Ladder-type Cable Tray Base Plate

Article Overview

Ladder-type cable tray guide plates should be installed to restrain cables, maintain alignment, and withstand mechanical forces, following manufacturer specifications and safety standards.

Purpose of Guide Plates

Guide plates in ladder-type cable trays are used to restrain cables, prevent lateral movement, and ensure that cables remain properly aligned within the tray. They are particularly important in installations where cables may be subjected to short-circuit forces, vibration, or heavy loads ().

Installation Steps

o Planning and Layout

o Follow a pre-determined layout plan designed by a qualified engineer familiar with local codes and building specifications ().

o Ensure that the tray system and guide plates are compatible and designed to work together as a system ().

o Positioning Guide Plates

o Place guide plates at regular intervals along the tray, typically near bends, splices, or where cable restraint is critical.

o Ensure that the plates are centered and flush with the tray edges to avoid interference with cable installation ().

o Securing Guide Plates

o Use the manufacturer-recommended hardware, such as carriage bolts, serrated flanged nuts, or self-tapping screws, to attach the guide plates to the tray ().

o Torque fasteners according to specifications (e.g., 3/8" fasteners to 19 ft-lbs) to ensure secure attachment without damaging the tray ().

o Support and Alignment

o Ensure that the tray and guide plates are supported adequately using strut supports, hangers, or brackets, maintaining the maximum support spacing recommended by the manufacturer (commonly 3.6 m for center-hung supports) ().

o Check that the guide plates are aligned vertically and horizontally to prevent cable pinching or misalignment.

o Load Considerations

o Verify that the guide plates and tray can handle the weight of installed cables and any additional imposed

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loads, including future cable additions ().

- o Avoid overloading any single support point; distribute loads evenly across the tray system.

- o Safety and Compliance

- o Do not cut or drill structural building members without approval ().

- o Ensure installation complies with BS EN 61537, local electrical codes, and occupational safety standards ().

- o Maintain minimum clearance around the tray (typically 12 inches above and to the side) for accessibility and maintenance ().

Final Checks

- o Inspect all guide plates for secure attachment and proper alignment.

- o Confirm that cables can be installed smoothly without obstruction.

- o Ensure that the system is accessible for future maintenance and that all fasteners are properly torqued. By following these steps, ladder-type cable tray guide plates will provide effective cable restraint, maintain system integrity, and comply with safety and structural standards.
