Ensure all personnel are trained, competent, and follow safety protocols, including site induction and use of personal protective equipment . Correct any unsafe conditions before proceeding with installation.

Maintain clear access for future cable additions or replacements. Proper spacing and organization prevent overheating and facilitate easy inspection or upgrades . Document the installation for reference in maintenance or expansion projects.
