

Is the optimal burial depth for fiber optic cables

Cable Type Considerations

- o Direct Burial Armored Cable: Designed for underground installation without conduit, featuring steel tape armor and water-blocking materials to resist moisture, rodents, and soil pressure .
- o Standard Outdoor Cable: Not suitable for direct burial; requires conduit protection to prevent damage from soil and environmental factors .

Soil and Environmental Factors

- o Rocky or sandy soils: Deeper burial or protective conduit is recommended to prevent abrasion and shifting .
- o Stable clay soils: Standard depths may suffice, but sand bedding is recommended to cushion the cable from soil pressure .
- o Areas prone to flooding or erosion: Additional depth or armored protection ensures long-term reliability .

Additional Best Practices

- o Maintain physical separation (typically 12 inches) from electrical power lines to prevent accidental energization during maintenance .
- o Always call local utility services (811 in the U.S.) before digging to avoid hitting existing underground utilities .
- o Using conduit can facilitate future cable upgrades without additional excavation, even when armored cable is used .
