Copper in Fiber Optic Cables

Most fiber optic cables are made primarily of glass or plastic fibers for data transmission, with copper used only in hybrid cables for power delivery (like in Power over Ethernet or hybrid fiber-copper cables) or in protective shielding layers . Pure fiber cables do not contain copper, so the cost of copper in these cables is negligible. In hybrid designs, the copper content is usually limited to a few conductors, which keeps material costs relatively low.

- o Copper cables: Standard copper cables, such as twisted pair or coaxial, have lower material costs and are often chosen for budget-sensitive installations . Copper prices fluctuate with the global metal market, but for cabling purposes, the material cost is typically well under \$1 per foot for standard conductors.
- o Fiber optic cables: Fiber cables cost \$1 to \$6 per foot depending on strand count, type (single-mode or multimode), and construction . The copper portion in hybrid cables adds only a small fraction to this cost.

Factors Affecting Copper Pricing in Fiber Cables

- o Copper gauge and number of conductors: Thicker or more numerous copper wires increase cost.
- o Cable type: Hybrid fiber-copper cables (used for powering devices or combining data and power) are more expensive than pure fiber cables.
- o Market fluctuations: Copper prices are influenced by global supply and demand, which can affect cable pricing.
- o Installation and shielding: Copper used for grounding or shielding adds to the cost but is minor compared to the fiber core and overall cable construction .

While copper is cheaper per foot than fiber, the overall cost of hybrid cables is driven primarily by the fiber component, not the copper. Businesses often choose fiber for long-term efficiency, lower maintenance, and higher bandwidth, despite the higher upfront cost .
