If the Ctrl key combination conflicts with programs running on your computer, you can switch the hotkey to the Scroll Lock key by pressing and holding both the CS-82A's Port Selection

Hot-key switching simply involves invoking the Hot-Key Mode followed by clicking the port ID (a character or a number) that the computer you want to switch to is connected to.
