Overview

A KVM (Keyboard, Video, Mouse) switch allows you to control multiple computers using one set of peripherals. For setups where your computers output HDMI but your monitor only accepts VGA, you need a KVM switch that either includes built-in HDMI-to-VGA conversion or requires an external HDMI-to-VGA adapter .

Key Features to Consider

- o Number of Ports: Choose a switch based on how many computers you want to connect. Common options include 2-port, 4-port, or 8-port models .
- o Resolution Support: Ensure the switch supports the resolution you need. Many HDMI-to-VGA KVM switches handle up to 1080p at 60Hz, while some advanced models can support higher resolutions with adapters .
- o USB Support: Most KVM switches also handle USB for keyboard and mouse. Some include USB 3.0 ports for high-speed peripherals .
- o Switching Methods: Switching between computers can be done via front panel buttons, keyboard hotkeys, or remote controllers .
- o Audio Support: Some models also transmit audio from HDMI to analog output, which can be useful if your monitor has speakers or you use external speakers .
