- o Allow 20-30% spare rack space for future expansion .

Cable Management

- o Route cables along vertical managers first, then horizontal managers, ensuring proper bend-radius compliance .

- o Use cable management accessories such as trays, ducts, raceways, Velcro ties, and brush panels to maintain neat pathways .

- o Avoid blocking vents and maintain clear pathways for air circulation. Proper cable routing also enhances ventilation .

Labeling and Documentation

- o Label both ends of every cable with its purpose to simplify troubleshooting and maintenance .
- o Maintain a structured cabling diagram to track connections and support scalability .

Safety and Compliance

- o Ensure cabinets are lockable to prevent unauthorized access .
