- o Label all circuits: Clearly mark phase, neutral (N), and protective earth (PE) wires, and identify each circuit to simplify maintenance .
- o Follow color codes and standards: Adhere to NEC, IEC, or local electrical codes for wiring and grounding .
- o Grounding and protection: Ensure dedicated grounding terminals, avoid direct welding to the cabinet, and use protective devices like RCDs, fuses, and surge protectors .
- o Use modular designs: DIN rails and comb busbars help organize connections and allow for future upgrades .
- o Regular inspection and maintenance: Perform visual checks and multimeter tests to detect loose connections or damaged insulation early .
