

Methods of covering up electrical boxes

Indoor Covering Options

Hinged Artwork or Frames: Mount a framed picture or canvas on piano hinges so it swings open like a cabinet door, allowing immediate access to the panel while maintaining the required clearance of 36 inches in front of the box and 30 inches wide . **Sliding Panels:** Install a lightweight wooden or canvas panel on thin metal or wire tracks above and below the box. The panel can slide horizontally to reveal the electrical box instantly, ensuring the main door can open fully . **Curtains or Fabric Panels:** Hang flame-resistant, lightweight fabric from a ceiling or wall track system, keeping it clear of the panel itself. This is a renter-friendly and temporary solution . **Room Dividers or Folding Screens:** Place a decorative folding screen in front of the panel, ensuring it does not encroach on the 36-inch working space. This allows easy removal during maintenance .

Outdoor Covering Options

Decorative Screens and Wooden Enclosures: Use rustic wooden screens, cedar panels, or custom-built garden boxes to conceal outdoor electrical panels. Ensure ventilation and maintain clearance for utility access . **Planter Boxes and Vertical Screening:** Position shrubs, ornamental grasses, or layered plantings around the box, keeping at least 3-4 feet distance for maintenance access. Weighted planters or container plantings allow flexibility and seasonal rotation . **Mini Garden Sheds or Cabinets:** Build a small shed or weatherproof cabinet around the panel for extra storage and concealment. Ensure the structure does not block the panel door and allows quick access . **Lattice Screens with Climbing Plants:** Install lattice panels painted in earth tones and add evergreen vines like ivy or clematis to camouflage the box while maintaining airflow and accessibility .

Safety Considerations

- o Maintain a minimum 36-inch clearance in front of the panel and 30 inches width, extending vertically to 6.5 feet .
- o Avoid highly flammable materials directly over the panel. Use flame-resistant or non-combustible coverings .
- o Ensure the cover is easily removable without tools for emergencies .
- o For outdoor boxes, allow ventilation to prevent moisture buildup and overheating . By combining these strategies, you can effectively hide an electrical box while keeping it safe, accessible, and visually appealing.
