Mozambique is significantly enhancing its digital infrastructure through new cross-border and submarine fiber optic cables, boosting connectivity, reliability, and internet capacity.

Cross-Border Fiber Links

Mozambique has recently installed two cross-border fiber optic cables to South Africa, providing alternative routes to standard subsea cables. One route passes through eSwatini, while the other goes through Komatipoort in Mpumalanga, South Africa. These dual routes ensure stability and resiliency, allowing uninterrupted communications in case of a cable outage. According to Paratus Group, this development gives Mozambique secure, fast, and redundant cross-border links with the rest of the world, strengthening the country's digital infrastructure .

Submarine Cable Connectivity

Mozambique is also connected to three major international submarine cables: SEACOM (2009), EASSy (2010), and 2Africa (2023). The 2Africa submarine cable, landed in Nacala and Maputo, is the world's largest submarine system and provides enhanced internet capacity and faster connectivity. Vodacom, the landing partner in Mozambique, manages infrastructure for these cables, offering a direct international gateway for reliable internet services. This cable supports Mozambique's growing digital economy and promotes digital inclusion across the country .

Domestic Fiber Infrastructure

Domestically, TELEVISA has installed over 120,000 km of optical fiber and 5,000 km of coaxial cable across Mozambique. Projects include FTTH networks, telephone networks in Pemba and Lichinga, optical rings for banks and TDM digital agencies, and high-capacity microwave backbones connecting major cities like Maputo, Beira, Nampula, and Tete. These initiatives enhance both urban and regional connectivity, supporting telecom operators like Tmcel, Vodacom, and Movitel .

The combination of cross-border terrestrial cables, submarine cables, and domestic fiber networks positions Mozambique for faster, more reliable, and resilient internet services. This infrastructure supports the digital economy, business growth, and improved access to online services, while also providing redundancy to prevent disruptions in communications. The country is now better integrated into the global digital network, enabling enhanced connectivity for both consumers and enterprises .
