

Article Overview

PLC cabinet wiring uses standardized color codes to identify AC/DC circuits, protective earth, neutral, and control wiring, ensuring safety and consistency in industrial automation systems.

Protective Earth and Neutral

- o Protective Earth (PE): Always green-and-yellow, with a 70/30 distribution over any 15mm length if insulated, or applied at accessible points if the wire is otherwise hidden. This ensures clear identification of grounding conductors throughout the system .
- o Neutral (N): Light blue is used exclusively for neutral conductors in AC circuits to prevent confusion with other wiring .

AC and DC Circuit Wiring

- o AC Circuits:
 - o Phase conductors typically use black, brown, grey, or white for lower voltages, and red, yellow, dark blue, or violet for higher voltages .
 - o Neutral remains light blue.
- o DC Circuits:
 - o Positive DC conductors are usually red or white.
 - o Negative DC conductors are black or blue.
 - o Grounded DC conductors may be white with a blue stripe .

Control and Safety Circuits

- o Ungrounded control circuits operating at supply voltage: black.
- o Ungrounded AC control circuits below supply voltage: red.
- o Ungrounded DC control circuits: blue.
- o Safety circuits: Often purple to indicate emergency or interlock functions .
- o External power sources or interconnects: yellow.
- o Battery circuits that remain energized when main power is off: orange .

HMI and Status Indicators

- o System stopped: Green/red combination.
- o System running: Red/green combination.
- o System tripped: Yellow.



PLC Cabinet Wiring Color Standards

- o System disabled or not in operation: Grey.
- o Manual restart required: Blue .

Best Practices

- o Always verify wire function with a meter, as colors may fade over time .
 - o Follow local electrical codes and international standards (EN 60204-1, IEC 60445, UL508A) for compliance .
 - o Maintain consistent color coding across multiple machines to simplify troubleshooting and maintenance .
- Using these standardized color codes ensures safety, reduces errors, and improves efficiency in PLC cabinet wiring and industrial automation systems.
