Labor constitutes a major portion of deployment costs, often 60-80%, with median labor costs around \$4 per foot for aerial builds using company-owned poles and \$7 per foot when renting poles from others. Methods such as Strand and Lash or All-Dielectric Self-Supporting (ADSS) cables have similar costs, approximately \$6.55-\$6.75 per foot .

Installation Considerations

Aerial deployment requires careful planning, including route surveys, pole readiness, permits, and coordination with local authorities. Existing poles may be shared, reducing costs and speeding deployment. Polyethylene (PE) jackets with carbon black are standard for UV protection. Safety protocols for workers, including proper ladder use and harnesses, are critical during installation .
