Facilities are engineered with dimensions like 8x4x4 meters, providing ample storage space and efficient organization for a variety of perishable products. These systems are capable of maintaining low-temperature conditions close to or below freezing, essential for sensitive horticultural and dairy products .

Solar and Off-Grid Solutions

To enhance sustainability and reduce reliance on unstable grid power, many cold storage projects incorporate solar energy. For example, the Agricoool initiative in the Niayes region plans to generate over 50 megawatts of solar power, with surplus energy available to the national grid . Off-grid and solar-powered cold rooms are particularly important in Senegal's hot climate, where ambient temperatures can reach 40-42°C, making conventional storage unreliable .
