

Setting up a wireless router for connecting to fiber optic internet in XP

- o Navigate to the Wireless Settings section.
- o Set a network name (SSID) for your Wi-Fi.
- o Choose WPA2 or WPA3 security and create a strong password.
- o Save the settings and reboot the router if necessary .

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Step 6: Optimize and Test

- o Update firmware if available to ensure security and performance.
- o Test the connection by browsing the internet or running a speed test.
- o For critical devices, consider using wired Ethernet connections for maximum speed and stability . By following these steps, your Windows XP system will be able to access high-speed fiber optic internet through a secure and optimized wireless router setup.
