- o Cable Type: Armored cables can resist intrusion and may be buried shallower than unarmored cables, which require deeper placement or conduit protection .
- o Environmental Conditions: Monsoon-prone regions, high water tables, and flood zones necessitate deeper burial (up to 1.5 meters) to prevent water pressure damage (~0.1 MPa) and erosion .
- o Traffic and Construction: Areas with heavy vehicle traffic or frequent excavation require deeper burial (1.2 meters or more) to avoid accidental cuts or crushing .

Best Practices

- o Trench Preparation: Ensure a flat trench bottom free of debris; add fine soil or sand layers for cushioning .
- o Protective Measures: Use conduits or armored cables in high-risk areas to reduce mechanical damage and environmental exposure .
- o Marking and Documentation: Clearly mark cable routes and record burial depths for future maintenance and excavation safety .
- o Urban vs. Rural Planning: Adjust depth according to local infrastructure, soil stability, and flood risk to balance protection and installation cost .
