

Standard dimensions of a three-level distribution box frame

Article Overview

A typical three-level distribution box frame has dimensions approximately 600-800 mm in height, 400-600 mm in width, and 150-250 mm in depth, depending on the manufacturer and configuration.

General Specifications

Three-level distribution boxes are designed to accommodate multiple rows of circuit breakers or modular components. Each "level" corresponds to a row of devices, and the frame dimensions are influenced by the number of ways per row and the spacing required for safe wiring and maintenance .

- o Height: Usually ranges from 600 mm to 800 mm for three levels, allowing sufficient space for three rows of modular devices .
- o Width: Typically 400 mm to 600 mm, depending on the number of ways per row and the type of enclosure (metal or plastic), .
- o Depth: Commonly 150 mm to 250 mm, providing enough room for busbars, wiring, and terminal connections .
- o Mounting: Frames often include pre-drilled holes or adjustable studs for easy installation on walls or inside larger enclosures .

Design Considerations

- o Row Spacing: Each level is spaced to allow safe access to terminals and to prevent overheating. Standard spacing is around 100-120 mm per level .
- o Compatibility: Frames are compatible with standard DIN rail-mounted devices such as MCBs, RCDs, and MCCBs .
- o Material: Typically made of metal (sheet steel) or high-strength plastic, ensuring durability and electrical safety .
- o Expansion: Some frames allow for vertical or horizontal extensions to accommodate additional levels or ways in the future .

Practical Example

For a three-level distribution box designed for residential or commercial use:

- o Height: 720 mm
- o Width: 500 mm
- o Depth: 200 mm

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- o Number of ways per row: 12-18
- o Total ways: 36-54 This configuration provides sufficient space for wiring, busbars, and future expansion while maintaining compliance with safety standards .
