

The pigtail needs to be re-inserted re-plugged

Automotive Pigtail Connector

Steps for re-plugging a damaged or disconnected automotive pigtail:

Medical Pigtail Catheter

Steps for re-inserting a pigtail catheter (e.g., chest drain):

- o Prepare Equipment: Ensure you have the pigtail catheter, guidewire, dilator, syringe, multipurpose tubing adaptor, and preassembled drainage system ready .
 - o Sterile Preparation: Clean and drape the insertion site using aseptic technique. Administer local anesthesia to skin, subcutaneous tissue, and pleura .
 - o Guidewire Placement: Insert a needle into the pleural space, confirm placement by aspirating air or fluid, then advance the guidewire gently without resistance .
 - o Dilate and Insert Catheter: Make a small incision, dilate the tract, and slide the pigtail catheter over the guidewire to the appropriate depth. Remove the obturator once the catheter is in place .
 - o Secure and Connect: Suture the catheter, attach the tubing to a drainage system or Heimlich valve, and ensure a proper skin seal with a sterile dressing .
 - o Confirm Placement: Verify correct positioning with imaging, such as a chest X-ray, to ensure all fenestrations are within the thoracic cavity .
- Key Considerations:** Always handle wires or catheters gently, confirm correct placement, and follow safety protocols to prevent complications or malfunction.
