- o ONT to router: An Ethernet cable links the ONT to a router, which then distributes the internet to devices via wired or wireless connections.
- o Router configuration: The router is configured to manage network traffic, assign IP addresses, and provide Wi-Fi access.

Fiber-Ready Routers

Some routers are fiber-ready, meaning they can directly interface with fiber connections using specialized ports (like SFP or WAN ports) or have a built-in ONT. However, even in these cases, the router is still a separate device from the fiber cable itself and performs the routing functions, while the fiber cable only transmits data.
