The National Electrical Code (NEC) governs electrical junction box rules. These rules define when you must install a box, how large it must be, how you must install it, and how inspectors evaluate compliance. A junction box protects wire connections from physical damage, reduces shock and fire risks. NEC requires junction boxes to meet size (box fill), material, accessibility, and grounding rules (per Articles 314 & 300). Non-compliance risks safety or code violations.
