

What does a fiber optic cable patch cord diagram mean

Duplex vs Simplex

- o Simplex: Single fiber, one-way transmission.
- o Duplex: Two fibers, allowing simultaneous bidirectional communication. Often color-coded (e.g., blue for transmit, beige for receive) ().

Connector Types

- o LC (Lucent Connector): Small form factor, push-pull mechanism.
- o SC (Subscriber Connector): Snap-in square connector.

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- o ST (Straight Tip): Bayonet mount, twist-lock style.
- o APC vs UPC: Angled Physical Contact (APC) reduces back reflection; Ultra Physical Contact (UPC) is flat-polished ().

Installation Tips

- o Maintain minimum bend radius to prevent signal loss.
- o Keep connectors clean; dust can degrade performance.
- o Ensure connector compatibility; mixing APC and UPC can cause signal issues ().
