What Fiber Optic Patch Cord Coding Means

Fiber optic patch cord coding is a system of visual and printed identifiers applied to fiber optic cables, connectors, and individual fibers to simplify identification, prevent miswiring, and improve network reliability . This coding includes:

- o Jacket Color: The outer jacket color indicates the fiber type and performance. For example, yellow jackets signify single-mode fibers (OS1/OS2), while multimode fibers use orange, aqua, violet, or lime green depending on the OM standard (OM1-OM5), . Jacket colors help technicians quickly identify the fiber type and its maximum supported speed and distance .
- o Connector Color: Connector housings are color-coded to indicate the polish type. Blue connectors are UPC (Ultra Physical Contact, flat polish), and green connectors are APC (Angled Physical Contact, 8-degree polish) to reduce return loss. Matching connector types is critical to avoid signal loss or damage .
- o Individual Fiber Color: Inside the patch cord, each fiber is coated with a color according to the TIA/EIA-598 standard. A 12-color sequence (Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate, White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, Aqua/Turquoise) is used to identify fibers in a group. For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with additional markings or stripes to maintain unique identification .
- o Printed Labels: Manufacturers often print fiber type, specifications, and length on the jacket to complement color coding, providing a clear reference for installation and maintenance .
