Fibre Channel also supports various upper-level protocols, including Fibre Channel Protocol (FCP) for transporting SCSI commands and FICON for IBM mainframe ESCON commands. Additionally, Fibre Channel over Ethernet (FCoE) encapsulates Fibre Channel traffic over standard Ethernet networks, providing flexibility in deployment.
