

What is the spacing between parallel cable trays

Article Overview

Parallel cable trays should be spaced at least 0.6 meters apart to allow maintenance, inspection, and proper airflow.

Horizontal Spacing Between Parallel Trays

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the minimum recommended distance is 0.6 meters. This spacing ensures adequate access for maintenance, inspection, and heat dissipation, while also reducing the risk of cables touching, which could lead to short circuits or interference (Apex Tray) . For power and signal cable trays, a horizontal separation of at least 0.5 meters is recommended to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI). If the trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to less than 0.3 meters due to the containment of EMI within the trays .

Vertical Spacing

For floor-mounted or stacked trays, the minimum vertical clearance should be 150 millimeters. This prevents obstruction, allows for future tray additions, and facilitates ventilation and cooling .

Support Spacing

Cable trays must be supported at regular intervals to maintain stability and prevent sagging. For ladder-type trays, supports should generally be placed every 4 to 6 feet (1.2 to 1.8 meters), with a maximum of 5 feet (1.5 meters) according to NEC guidelines. Rungs in ladder trays should not exceed 9 inches (230 mm) apart to ensure proper cable support .

Additional Considerations

- o Ensure trays are installed with proper airflow to prevent overheating.
- o Maintain clearances for inspection and maintenance access.
- o Consider the type of cables and environmental conditions, as these may affect spacing requirements.
- o Use appropriate mounting elements and supports to secure trays to ceilings, walls, or floors . By following these spacing guidelines, you can ensure safe, efficient, and code-compliant cable tray installations while minimizing EMI and facilitating future maintenance.
