

What tools are needed for cable distribution boxes

- o Hole Saws: Used to create openings for cable entry .
- o Banding Tools: Include tensioning tools, metal shears, and stainless steel banding for mounting boxes securely .

Testing and Safety Tools

- o Multimeter: To check voltage, continuity, and ensure proper wiring .
- o Insulation Resistance Tester: Verifies insulation integrity before powering the system .
- o Electrical Tester: Confirms that power is off before starting installation .
- o Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): Insulated gloves, safety glasses, slip-resistant shoes, and flame-resistant clothing for protection against electrical hazards .

- o Cable Cutters: For precise cutting of Ethernet or coaxial cables .
