

What type of patch cord is used for fiber optic terminal boxes

Jacket Material

- o PVC: Standard indoor use, not suitable for air ducts .
- o Plenum (OFNP): Fire-resistant, safe for air ducts .
- o Riser (OFNR): For vertical shafts between floors .
- o LSZH (Low Smoke Zero Halogen): Emits minimal smoke and toxic gas, ideal for high-safety areas or European standards .

Simplex vs Duplex

- o Simplex: Single fiber, unidirectional transmission, used for one-way communication .
- o Duplex: Two fibers, bidirectional transmission, commonly used in terminal boxes for simultaneous send/receive operations .

Environmental Considerations

- o Indoor vs Outdoor: Indoor patch cords are flexible and lightweight; outdoor or indoor/outdoor cords may

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include UV-resistant jackets or water-blocking features .

- o Bend-Insensitive Fiber (G.657A1/A2): Recommended for tight spaces or FTTH applications to prevent signal loss due to sharp bends .
