They are suitable for mixed cable types, structured cabling, and indoor environments where some airflow is needed but full exposure is not ideal . They also help maintain a neat appearance and reduce dust accumulation.

### Solid-Bottom Cable Trays

Solid-bottom trays fully enclose cables, offering maximum protection against dust, moisture, and contaminants. They are ideal for sensitive data, control systems, hospitals, and clean rooms where cable protection is critical . However, they provide less natural heat dissipation compared to ladder trays.

### Wire Mesh and Channel Trays

Wire mesh trays are lightweight, flexible, and highly ventilated, making them suitable for fiber optic, low-voltage, and telecom cables. Channel trays are compact and designed for short runs and light cables, often in tight spaces .
